
- Living the liturgy by witness and action.

Leadership, Mentorship, and Strengthened Faith


Older youth mentor and guide new members. All involved strengthen their Orthodox faith!

Why Appalachia?

ASP Serves in Central Appalachia, in West Virginia, Kentucky, Tennessee, Virginia, and North Carolina.

Food deserts & food insecurity

16% poverty rate

Limited access to healthcare and education resources

Vulnerability to destructive flooding & severe cold

Resilient, faithful, kind people with a rich culture and strong communities!

Fewer job opportunities & high disability rate



ASP Fast Facts

- Founded in 1969 by Tex Evans.
 - OYMT participated in ASP's 50th Summer of Service in 2018!
- Mission: A Christian ministry, open to all people, that inspires hope and service through volunteer home repair and replacement in Central Appalachia.
- Motto: Making homes warmer, safer, and drier.
- Where ASP Serves:
 - June August: 20-30 communities across Central Appalachia. Schools, churches, etc. serve as summer centers for volunteers and staff.
 - September May: ASP operates from permanent facilities in VA and TN to provide critical home repair and replacement in Appalachia.
- Each Year:
 - More than 25 communities are served.
 - More than 350 families are impacted.
 - More than 3,000 repair projects are completed.
 - More than 20 new homes are built.
 - More than 15,000 volunteers serve with ASP!

Before the Trip





- Monthly Sunday sessions.
- Safety, Sensitivity, and Stewardship training.
- Tool training and two construction days.
- Learning about the area we will serve.
- Fundraising and trip preparation.
- Opportunities for local service built in.
- Bonding and team building!



A Typical ASP Trip





- 9 days, 8 nights in July (Saturday Sunday).
- First Saturday = travel day. Night spent in a hotel.
- Liturgy on Sunday, then continue on to center.
- Six nights at the volunteer center (Sun Sat).
- Five construction days at the worksites (Mon-Fri).
- Travel day Saturday with fun activity.
- Liturgy on our way home Sunday.

On the Way Down





- Saturday is spent traveling.
- Arrive in Virginia in the evening and share a meal.
- Opportunity for relaxation and bonding.
- Van decorating!
- Liturgy Sunday morning.
- Hosting parish always puts out a beautiful spread!
- Receive the trip's T-shirts and continue to center.

The Center





- Typically a school or former school in the County.
- Four college student Center Staff members.
- Separate sleeping areas no purpling! Sleep on air mattresses in gym or classrooms.
- Common meals prepared by local cooks.
- Local maintenance staff, but daily chores for all volunteers.
- Plenty of space for recreation and bonding!
- May or may not have air conditioning, indoor showers (typically have hot water), or cell service.

The Worksites





- Work crews of 2 Adult Leaders & 5-7 Youth.
- 1-2 work crews assigned to a home for the week.
- Youth participate in roofing, drywall, siding, flooring, porch/ramp, demolition, painting, and other projects!
- Absolutely NO power tool use without adult supervision.
- Life-long relationships built with homeowners.
- Youth take responsibility for tool gathering & maintenance, worksite safety & stewardship, and packing lunches & water for crew & homeowners.

It's Not All Work!





- Each morning starts with a Devotional (Devo).
- Center Staff run nightly Evening Gatherings.
- Culture Night on Tuesday! Family Picnic Thursday!
- Friday evening Share Circle/God Moments.
- Theme Days!!
- Opportunity to learn about being on Staff in College.
- Morning music wake-ups; sing-alongs.
- Warm & Fuzzies!
- Fun structured & unstructered evening activities, ball games, cards, etc.



OYMT's Personal Touches





- Daily Prayers every Morning & Evening.
- Sundae Monday!
- Focusing our Devos on Scripture.
- Youth send postcards to our supporters back home, and write reflections on their week.
- We leave each home with an icon and enjoy sharing our Orthodox faith with everyone around us throughout the week.
- When possible, we fill our entire Volunteer Center with our Team & satellite teams (60–100 people)!

On Our Way Home





- Friday night = clean up & pack up.
- Saturday breakfast somewhere in the county.
- Saturday = travel day. Night spent in a hotel.
- Fun activity that allows the team to relax together and solidify the bonds they built on the trip.
- Liturgy and coffee hour Sunday morning.
- Arrive home Sunday evening!

Experienced Youth Trips





- In summer 2017, we took our older, returning Youth to Napaskiak, Alaska for a 12 day mission trip.
- OCMC rarely allows youth without their parents!
- Hosted a Vacation Church School (~ 50 kids!), laid a church foundation, and installed a cupola.
- Countless opportunities for liturgy, song, visiting villagers' homes, ministry, and incredible experiences!
- Opportunity for older Youth to experience a more "adult" short term mission, building on ASP experience.
- COVID was a setback, but goal is to provide more trips like this for experienced Youth members!




Age 18-24 = Reach out to us!

- All members sign an annual covenant affirming their commitment to the Team and that year's mission trip.
- Youth must complete 8th-12th grade in the school year before an ASP trip.
- Cost per trip per Youth is \$350, paid in two deposits.
 - Scholarships are available no Youth will EVER be turned away for inability to pay the volunteer fee.
 - Fee is nonrefundable if Youth violates covenant (e.g., sent home from trip)
- Adult Leaders do not pay a fee as they generally must take off work to participate.
- Participation in team fundraising is mandatory to cover other expenses.
- All members are given an annual schedule of trainings. These are essential and attendance must be made a priority!
- Each trip's roster must be finalized no later than January 1st.
