ASP'S SUMMER 2023 THEME

Summer Mission Trip 2023: Appalachia Service Project

Greenbrier County, West Virginia

This year the Orthodox Youth Mission Team (OYMT) led by Fr. Luke Mihaly of Holy Trinity in Danbury, filled an entire ASP volunteer center in Greenbrier County, WV. Our group of 55 youth and adult leaders was comprised of members from six ACROD, GOARCH, and OCA parishes in CT, NY, and MD. It was truly a unique opportunity for Orthodox high school youth to come together, build connections across multiple jurisdictions, and serve Christ on an authentic mission experience.

Our team helped 7 families make their homes "warmer, safer and drier" by taking on roofing, siding, insulation, framing, sheetrock, painting, sub flooring, flooring, and deck construction projects.

More important than the construction work was the opportunity to bring hope to Appalachian families by sharing the love of Christ with them. At the end of the week, we presented each family with an icon. The team built meaningful connections with our homeowners and in the community, and participated in many social, cultural, and devotional activities at the volunteer center.

In our travels, we were blessed to visit Holy Trinity Greek Orthoodox Church in Roanoke, Virginia, and St. Michael's in St. Clair, Pennsylvania. Parishioners greeted us with a warm welcome and gracious hospitality following Divine Liturgy.

This was OYMT's 11th mission trip and 13th year of service, and we are grateful to our Lord for this amazing opportunity to make Him present by serving others, and to all of you for your prayers, generosity, and ongoing support.

This year, ASP's summer volunteer theme was based on Luke 10:27: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with sll your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind and love your neighbor as yourself."
